We buy back textbooks throughout the year as wholesale prices dictate, but at the end of fall and spring terms, during finals, we can offer up to 50% of the original cost for texts being used in the next term. Our Returns Policy is as follows:

Receipt is required for all refunds.

Textbooks may be returned for a full refund each term for 30 days from purchase date or the last day of Add/Drop, whichever comes first. Receipt required

Clothing, gift and school supplies maybe returned as long as merchandise is current and in sellable condition. Receipt required.

Study aids and reference materials are non-refundable. They may, however, be exchanged within five days of purchase. Receipt required.

REGISTRAR'S OFFICE


