The competition packet will be issued on January 25, 2013, at 5:00 PM. Written briefs will be due by 5:00 PM on February 11, 2013. Oral arguments are tentatively scheduled for February 18 and 20 starting at 6:00 PM. Each competitor will argue a total of four times, twice on February 18 (on-brief) and twice of Feb 20 (off-brief). The two finalists will compete in one last round on February 21.

Dinah Shelton holds the Manatt/Ahn Professorship in International Law at the George Washington University Law School, where she has taught since 2004. She is the author of Protecting Human Rights in the Americas, Remedies in International Human Rights Law, and the three-volume Encyclopedia of Genocide and Crimes against Humanity. In 2006, Shelton was awarded the Elisabeth Haub Prize for Environmental Law. She is a member of the Inter-American Human Rights Commission, for which she has served as president since 2010.

FROM THE LIBRARY

As always, the library staff is looking for new and easier ways to help you conduct legal research. As we often say, Lexis and Westlaw, while very nice and relatively easy to use, are NOT the end-all solution for your research needs. This is illustrated by the fact that some valuable resources are still not found on these databases, such as the Congressional Research Service (CRS) Reports. A non-partisan branch of the Library of Congress, CRS is tasked with providing research on a broad range of topics Congress. From reports on flood insurance to immigration reform, CRS reports are a valuable tool for staying abreast of current trends in lawmaking. Bringing together analysis and statistics, these reports are a handy way to gain knowledge on any number of hot legal topics. CRS Reports are available electronically both on the open web through the Open CRS website and on Bloomberg Law under the Federal Legislative History Tab.
